Our AED (Automated External Defibrillator) units have been repositioned on the new posts provided by Sumter County.

We encourage all residents to take a few minutes to drive around Castleberry Circle and familiarize themselves with the locations of both AED units. Being able to locate an AED quickly can make a life-saving difference.

Sumter County has followed through on their commitments to our community. The new AED posts are: High-quality and durable; Highly visible for quick identification; Equipped with solar lighting for nighttime access; and contain an audio alarm when the access door is opened.

As discussed in previous Castleberry Circle meetings, Sumter County will continue to support our AED program by: Replacing AED batteries as needed: Providing new AED pads before expiration: Replacing AED units when their lifecycle is complete or they are lost or stolen

We are currently transitioning our responders to the PulsePoint app, provided at no cost by Sumter County.

PulsePoint will: Replace our current system (ReadyAlert), which we pay a monthly usage fee; Provide improved emergency response coordination; Be available to our Castleberry Circle community at no cost.

We will continue to keep residents informed as we make further improvements to our community emergency response capabilities.
